I found the settings I need to be able to disable the on-board i810. When I looked inside, I looked where they were supposed to be and my dad saw that the pins were removed. It seems Hewlett Packard removed hem to prevent us "Customers" from upgrading our comps. Quote: There are no jumper blocks to set on this motherboard. Intel Socket 370 Celeron processors have locked frequency multiples and use an external frequency of 66 MHz.
