In short: it doesn't matter. There's a patch, I think BI created it, which allows you to put it higher but all those who tested it said there was no noticable difference.

It's far more important to have a stable SFP - be it at 40, 50 or 60 - than to have a high SFPS. When SFPS is unstable and keeps moving between 60-65 you'll experience more lag than when it stays stable at 50.
