Motherboard: ASUS Maximus Formula (flashed to Rampage Formula using it's BIOS, since

they're the same thing anyway)

CPU: Intel Core 2 Duo E8600 3.33GHz @4.50GHz CPU Cooler: Xigmatech s1283 w/ retention bracket

RAM: 4GB (2x 2GB) Corsair XMS2 800MHz DDR2 @5-5-5-18 900MHz (had 8GB, as shown in the pictures, but it forced me to use 4.0GHz and higher voltages, and since 8GB is massive

overkill, I took it out)

GPU: MSI nVidia GeForce 8800GT OC 512MB HDD: 4x 640GB Western Digital Caviar SE16 AAKS Monitor: IBM P275 21" CRT 1600x1200 @100Hz

Speakers: Logitech Z2300 2.1

OS: Windows XP SP3 & Windows 7 x64 BETA (will get Windows 7 x64 Home Premium upon release)
