Hamachi I believe not exactly sure how it works but it would make sense because you don't have to open port is client - hamachi server - server. But I also believe it can be client - your server and it just uses the hamachi server for the sever list like xwis and renegade. Didn't exactly put too much effort into looking into that.

It also depends on the ISP. If you ban the first 2 numbers you usually ban the whole ISP of a large portion of it. My ISP's dynamic ip changes the whole thing completely oddly enough if you disconnect your router for an hour. For the DNS i use openDNS that's not my ISP's default DNS. That's also not the DNS server you're looking at that's the hostmask the server puts on it to help identify the client DNS server resolves names to numbers

Example google.com -> 255.255.255.255:80
