My ISP's dynamic ip changes the whole thing completely oddly enough if you disconnect your router for an hour. For the DNS i use openDNS that's not my ISP's default DNS. That's also not the DNS server you're looking at that's the hostmask the server puts on it to help identify the client DNS server resolves names to numbers

Example google.com -> 255.255.255.255:80
