Quote:'In the Netherlands, both in the police and outside, a great deal of attention is devoted to the low percentage of crimes that are solved. This percentage is approximately 10 %. In the surrounding countries, particularly in Germany, this percentage is significantly higher (40 - 50 %). According to a number of legal experts, this is because the detection of crime and the prosecution of suspects is not always obligatory in the Netherlands (Legality principle). On the grounds of general interest, (further) prosecution by the Public Prosecutor can be abandoned (Principle of Appropriateness). The question whether this scope also applies for detection is answered by jurisprudence in the 'Broodjeswinkel decision' of 31 January 1950. Detection is 'only' compulsory when it is part of the normal course of events and the normal conduct of the detective is in accordance with the task. This prevents the wastage of a low detection capacity.'
