You have to slice up the whole website into percentages. I would suggest drawing your whole website out on a piece of paper and estimating the percentages. When your done add all the wdths together and make sure they equal 100. Do the same with the height. Then write the HTML. Once that first "draft" is done look at the site and slowly make changes. If you make one box bigger you have to make another smaller. Your total always has to equal 100.

You missed 1 (or 3) quotation marks. Your retarded self forgot to add a quotation mark around the 50%, and it'd probably be best if you had quotations around the 60%, but not needed.

As for the position absolute: duh it's going to move per resolution. The absolute position means that it will be at the same point whether or not the resolution changes.

Example:

A point at (2, 2) on a 4 x 4 grid

Now the same point (2, 2) on a 8 x 8 grid.

See, instead of the point staying near the middle as in the first example, it ended up being towards the top left hand corner on the second example.
