





A great idea for RenGuard, but also a great idea for virus writers who want to hide their code. So, because some virus writers use SVKP, Norton (stupidly) marked this as a virus, even though it's not and never was.

I hope you can all get your Norton fixed not to detect this.

Ok, I've been playing Renegade for quite a while using Renguard without any major incidents....until now. I'm just going to load up GSA and find a server like usual, except I get an error message along with my Norton Internet Security that I have a virus on my system. I've attached the picture of the error message to this. Now I thought at first that this might be affecting everything. But when I tried to access other programs like Internet Explorer, other games i play online, or just even other crap, NOTHING happens. This only occurs when I try to access the Renguard network. Also, I attached a picture of what Norton says this virus is supposed to do.

What it's supposed to do throws me off a little. Who would take the time to find a way to block me out of Renguard? I'm not a huge tech person, so I don't really know all of the possibilities on what could've happened. My guess (which is completely without evidence) is that someone who has played Renegade with me before doesn't like me...and just decided to send me a present to be an asshole. Like I said, I don't know. Hopefully you guys may know something I don't. Anything at all will be helpful. I will exhaust every possible option before I'm forced to do a system restore. If there's some way you can track something through the Renguard network like this, you guys would be the ones to ask.

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Nobody is getting "infected". Norton has simply added SVKP to their list of antivirus definitions, most probably because some real virus or worm they found was packed with SVKP. So everyone using NAV who updates their definitions seems to be "suddenly infected". SVKP has been part of RenGuard all along, and is nothing bad.

SVKP is a protection that RenGuard uses, it basically encrypts renguard so that people cannot easily hex edit it or use debuggers on it and otherwise reverse engineer it so they can bypass it.

Sadly apparently someone used SVKP to protect some malicious program that Norton analyzed, so instead of fingerprinting that specific worm, they added svkp.sys to their blacklist...pretty silly but ah well what can we do.

Again, I say, SVKP is NOT a worm, virus, trojan, or anything bad. It is part of RenGuards protection. BHS paid money for SVKP. It is protection software, not a "hacker tool" or backdoor program.

If you remove svkp.sys, RenGuard will cease to function. The recommended way to get around this "problem" is to, as posted, remove svkp.sys from the norton quarantine list. Another option is to not use Norton, but for all we know Norton shares their virus definitions with others and svkp

will show up soon for other antivirus programs.

This isn't really a big deal, the important things are that svkp.sys is not anything malicious, and all antivirus programs have a way to add programs to a "whitelist", so you don't get constant warnings.

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Alright: Norton AntiVirus just complained about SVKP.sys for a second time on my machine (eg, after I had solved the problem locally), so it seems like this isn't going to go away easily. First up: Go complain about this problem to Symantec. They caused the problem.

Now that that's said, let's get RenGuard working again. That is, working until Norton AntiVirus decides to fuck it up again. My instructions will be very specific, so if you fuck up, it's your fault. Also, these instructions will require two reboots.

- 1) Let's add SVKP.sys to Norton two exclusions lists.
- 1a) Open Norton AntiVirus.
- 1b) Click on "Options" at the top of the window
- 1c) On the left, under "System", click on "Manual Scan"
- 1d) Two items will appear under "Manual Scan", click on "Exclusions"
- 1e) On the right, click "New"
- 1f) Type in "C:\WINDOWS\system32\SVKP.sys"
- 1g) Click "OK"
- 1h) Click "OK"
- 1i) Click "Options" again
- 1j) On the left, click on "Threat Categories"
- 1k) Two items appear, click on "Exclusions"
- 11) On the right, click "New"
- 1m) Type in "C:\WINDOWS\system32\SVKP.sys"
- 1n) Click "OK"
- 1o) Click "OK"
- 2) Now that SVKP has been added to Norton AntiVirus's exclusion lists, we'll need to make sure that it's also not in the Quarantine list.
- 2a) On the left (Norton AntiVirus should still be open... if not, open it again you silly!), click on "Reports"
- 2b) In the top center, click on "View Quarantined Items"
- 2c) Look for an item in the list with a file name of "SVKP.sys" and a threat name of "Hacktool.rootkit" (or something very similar)
- 2d) If you find an item in the Quarantine list which matches the description, then right click it and select "Restore"
- 2e) When you're finished (or if you did not find anything in the Quarantine list that matches the description), close the Quarantine list, and close Norton AntiVirus.
- 3) Because Norton AntiVirus is a piece of shit, you will now need to reboot your machine for the exclusions to take affect. So, reboot. This tutorial will be here when you get back.

- 4) Uninstall RenGuard and SVKP
- 4a) Use RenGuard's installer -- if you do not have it, then re-download it from www.renguard.com!
- 4b) Click Start -> Run and type in "regedit" to open Registry Edit.

4c) Remove the registry key

HKEY LOCAL MACHINE\SYSTEM\CurrentControlSet\Services\SVKP.

4d) Remove the registry key

HKEY LOCAL\_MACHINE\SYSTEM\CurrentControlSet\Enum\Root\LEGACY\_SVKP.

- 4e) Close RegEdit
- 5) Reinstall RenGuard (which will also reinstall SVKP)
- 6) Reboot your machine

If you did everything correctly, RenGuard should now work. CorePatch 1 will be redownloaded, even if you already have it installed... silly RenGuard can't see that the files are already from CorePatch 1. Downloading and installing CorePatch 1 again will not hurt anything. If you do not want to wait for CorePatch 1 to download, then you can disable it from RenGuard's options window.

Also remember than when installing CorePatch 1, the error 17 at the end is fine.

Norton is detecting svkp.sys as "Hacktool.rootkit", which is just a generic classification of "we think this is a tool that hackers might use". It is more of an informational/caution message than an actual virus hit. What I mean to say is, by telling Norton to ignore svkp.sys, you are not making yourself vulnerable to viruses or trojans that use svkp, because Norton would fingerprint that specific virus, and there would be a special definitition for it like "rootkit.w32SomeTrojan". Antivirus scanners mostly work off of "fingerprints", which are CRC/checksums of parts of files. If a real virus was released that used svkp, Norton would not rely on just finding svkp.sys to detect it, it would have a fingerprint of the main virus executable itself, so you would still be protected.

People who have gotten the infected version are the ones who got the Error: failed to initialize service! when trying to start RG.

Norton has added it to its bad list because of that virus that was going around.

Norton gives you the virus found message even after you have deleted or quarantined the svkp.sys file when starting RG because RG uses the svkp.sys and Norton detects that svkp.sys and RG work off eachother to infect your computer.

I have replaced my svkp.sys to get RG working. I got rid of Norton so I don't have to deal with its messages because I personally don't like putting a file used for viruses on a ignore list.

Please try this working AntiVirus freeware if you don't want Norton but don't have any idea what you would get instead.

I work for a nonprofit company that provides legacy support for a particular game title. One of our products is an anti-cheat addon, which utilizes the "SVKP Protector" to encrypt and protect our code from crackers.

In effect, every game client (thousands) are using our module, which utilizes SVKP.

The problem is that as of last week, Symantec added SVKP to their virus definitions as "Hacktool.Rootkit".

This is causing \*major\* disruption of our customers who use Symantec security products, as their game clients no longer work, and we are being flooded with support issues as the average joe user just sees a popup that they are "infected" and want to know why our software is a virus or trojan.

Please reply ASAP and let me know the procedure for requesting removal or alteration of a virus definition, or at least it's description page (

http://securityresponse.symantec.com/avcenter/venc/data/hack tool.rootkit.html), to include information to the effect of that just because a program is using SVKP, doesn't mean its a backdoor/trojan/rootkit.

Our company pays a licensing fee to use SVKP, and Symantec has pretty much pulled the rug out from under us....please advise.

Firstly, we cannot "eliminate the need for" the tool. If RG is not encrypted, there would be cracked copies of it out within 24 hours, and people would even be poking around it with a hex editor. And I would like to point out, that there has been no "virus warning". The alert the Symantec/Norton gives, if you actually take the time to read it, is that svkp.sys is not a virus itself, but rather may be part of or indication of another virus or trojan. To be honest, I have never heard or actually seen SVKP used for an actual virus, most script kiddies use UPX and other free exe wrappers.

New viruses are NOT caught in time by anti-virus companies all the time. So by white listing a

blocked tool you put yourself at a higher risk then is recommended. Just to use your program. As I said, blacklisting SVKP is about as silly as blacklisting Visual C++, since afterall, they can both be used to create or part of a virus. If its possible, I would recommend some combination of settings such that svkp.sys is ignored, except if something tries to overwrite it.

That particular worm not only creates an SVKP.sys, it also exploits a bug in windows PNP (which has long since been fixed), and connects to an irc network. For to get infected by that worm, they would have to have a non-updated windows installation, the virus infection, and no firewall whatsoever (or at least one that wouldnt stop or popup on the outgoing irc connection). If they meet any of those criteria, I doubt blacklisting svkp will make them any more secure

Until I hear of a significant number of cases where an actual virus uses SVKP, I would not be concerned at all about whitelisting SVKP.sys. The very URL you provided as "proof", shows that the number of reported infections were "0-49"...I bet it was a lot closer to 0 (like a single report), than it was to 49.

Despite my views, I do recognize that it's your computer and you are entitled to be a paranoid as you want. Just know that we are very aware of the issue and are taking steps to do what we can, including considering a different protection software for RG 1.04, and accelerating the development of RG 1.04.

There has been a very isolated report to Symantic of a virus that used SVKP.sys. For all we know it is the very incident that caused them to put SVKP.sys on their blacklist. The strange thing is it's not often that anti-v companies add a \*file name\* to their blacklist, usually the fingerprint specific virii and detect them that way.

So, to answer your question, will blocking SVKP.sys stop any viruses that may use SVKP? Yes.

But also consider, that SVKP itself is not a "hacker tool", or a virus, or a trojan. It is the kernel mode driver part of the SVK Protection software, so basically, just because you have an SVKP.sys, doesn't mean you have a virus.

Think of it this way. Your car has blinking red lights to alert you of problems. So, does making sure there are no blinking red lights mean that your car is fine? Yes, but also just becauser there is a blinking light, doesn't mean it's something bad (alarm system?). So instead of making sure there are no blinking lights in your car, you consciously ignore the alarm system blinking light, because you know it's harmless. Same for SVKP.sys. If there was a real virus that used SVKP.sys, there would surely be other indications of it via either a direct fingerprint id by your antivirus, or your firewall, etc.
