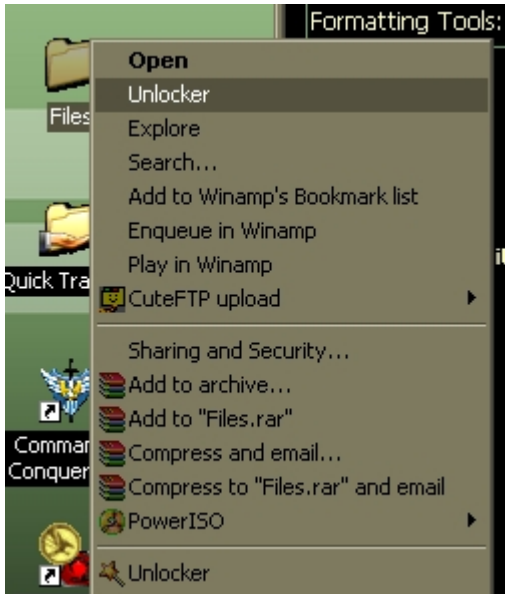
Basically what it does is un hooks the file/folder from anything that is using it. It makes a nice little right-click menu for easy use.
