SVKP, an executable packer, is used by some trojans to conceal their inner workings, and as such it is flagged by some anti-virus products. Ignore the warning, RenGuard will not cause harm to your machine.

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Your malware program is designed to find specific malware. Each malware has some characteristics. It's highly probable that if you have svkp.sys running, that's the characteristic for that specific malware. So it's a false positive.

I guess Destroyer is the updated name they are calling it, and was distributed as freeware.

Unfortunately, with both being from the same people, it is probable that the false positives do exist. This is not to say false positives are bad, as they will catch more things than something that doesn't, but you still have to be careful that what is shown is, in fact, the real thing.

In the case of Renguard, it's a false positive. No one else has has this occur, and many people here are quite proficient when it comes to computer maintenance.
