Okay, so I was playing Renegade online one night, and it froze, and the game closed. Every time I opened it, it had to send an error report and closed. All I had to do is replace the script.dll or whatever.

It happened again, and I had to uninstall, and then install ALL of the installed TFD games to get it to work again.

It happened again, but I don't want to go through reinstalling everything again.

I am using Windows XP Home Service Pack 2.

=Things that don't work=

- Replacing the script.dll
- Repairing(reinstalling) TFD
- Removing Renegade from TFD, and then adding it back
- Disabling error reporting
- Replacing the game2.exe

I have RenGuard with CP 2, but it doesn't work so I just use Game2.exe.

I would like to NOT spend 2 hours uninstalling and reinstalling TFD.
