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There are very few ways if any to hide your ip address from a server since the ip address is used to send the data back to you.

Imagine trying to send data to a server but a server doesn't know where to send the data after?
Lets just place it in the *nix /dev/null

You -> Server -> Huh? No Return Address. /dev/null

However that being said you can use a proxy to hide your identify to a certain extent, being the proxy server knows your ip address but uses the proxys ip address to return the requested data. For a world trip it would look like this:

You -> Proxy -> Server -> Proxy -> You

However adding proxies can seriously slow down your internet capabilities since quite a few proxies are on slow connections.

Don't bother trying with Renegade, without serious TCP/IP knowledge you won't be able to redirect the direct connection made with the game server through hidden connections. netstat -b doesn't work for instance.

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You need to know a few things about what IPs are. First of all, most ISPs rent IP addresses out to all of its customers. These IPs have a set expiration date.

So they rent out an IP to you, and by XXX amount of time, they recall it and then they give you either the same one back (renew it) or they give you a new one to use.

By knowing that alone, the only possible way that someone could find your address and location from an IP address is if someone could hack into your ISP's database, decode their files, and link your current IP to one in their computers.
