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A paradox is just an unanswered question. There's two views that I think are most probable relating to time travel, one being that you simply cannot change the past. You might go back in time with intent to change something, but the fact is, it never happened, so you didn't change it. This is of course, assuming that there is merely one timeline. The most widespread example of the time paradox is going back in time and killing yourself. Most people say, "Well, if you killed yourself, you can't go back in time to do it, so you're still alive, so you go back in time to kill yourself..."

This explanation is far too overcomplicated. If you're still alive to use the time machine, then you never kill yourself. Perhaps you go back in time, but you do not end up killing yourself, regardless of what happens. Maybe you change your mind, or something stops you, but you cannot change that which has already happened, even if you can go back to the point at which it happened.

My other opinion, and the one I favor of the two, is much like from the book *Timeline*. There's multiple timelines. If you go back or forward in time, you are no longer in the same dimensional parallel from whence you left, you are now in a new one, going either slower or faster than the one you left.

The way *Timeline* expresses it is that there is an infinite amount of parallel universes, each one different than the others no matter how small a difference it is. One is exactly the same as ours, but a second behind. Another is two seconds behind, another three seconds, et cetera, and I think this to be the most likely possibility. Therefore, if you go into a parallel universe behind ours and change something, you're not changing your present, you're changing their future, something quite different than your present.

If it CAN be changed:

1. there are a lot of ways man can achieve warp speeds but first I will start with man's latest stride toward achieving success. This started in WWII when German scientists started development of a "buzz bomb" which used a revolutionary engine that used a pulse detonation method that simply has an array of tubes and the ends of each tube were sealed off and there was an explosion in one tube then an explosion immediately after the first in the next tube and so on, but the Germans never really made it happen because the US and Russia stormed them and captured all of them and their research. Well not some 20 years later the idea of this "pulse detonation" started to seem kind of a good idea, not they got a pulse detonation engine that goes about 400 cycles per second with 6 tubes creating hundreds of pounds of thrust in milliseconds using even less gas. An engine like this would be perfect for space ships and other things but there is still a way to go. Now to actual warp engines, first we start with radiation sails, simple design where most of the ship is a huge sail that lets radiation pass through one side but not the other building up radiation pressure on one side and not the other pushing the ship forward.

Next we have real warp where time and space gets warped with a Disjunction drive which would be creating a field and separating reactions of the field from the field creating forces that would accrete with the field without the field

then we have the induction ring which uses a ring of negative energy to form a bubble of space around it which would enable it to move anywhere in the universe almost instantly

then we have the diametric drive by creating a positive field behind the ship and a negative field behind it and rides the energy flow from one field to another

lastly then bias drive which alters the properties of space itself, it would reduce the gravity in front of it and strengthen the gravity behind it so the ship would move to the lower gravity region

Harry Saldon, a character in those books, has created a thing called Psycho-History. It explains all the workings of the idea.... However, it also explains, in the later books, why it doesn't work,

although the illusion of it working still exists.

The future is not written. But, it is just "simple" math, to calculate what is going to happen next. Then you just change various variables and parameters to affect the future (not change it, cause it hasn't happened yet).

It is the scientific counterpart of Theology's "free will" that God has granted humans.

Frank Herbert, and now Brian and Kevin, explains it with the Guild Navigators, the Mentat Emperor Paul Moad'dib Atreides and the God Emperor Leto Atreides II (the most prominent example).
